

Formatting and Citation of a Paper in APA Style - 2021 Guide

Everyone is familiar with the dread that ensues as soon as they find out their paper needs to be properly formatted. As if writing a properly-themed and well-researched paper wasn't enough already; you now have to take the time to format it as well. And naturally, that throws citing your [write my essay for me](#) sources into the mix as well.



Formatting your paper and citing sources can vary greatly. And the amount of work you have to do depends entirely on the **Citation Styles** you are using. So, today we are going to learn about one of those styles set by the American Psychological Association or APA. A style that is discussed in great detail down below.

The Format

There are several different things that fall under the format of your paper. All of which completely change the way your paper looks and reads. As such, the format has been divided into different categories and is discussed below.

General

There are a set of basic rules that you have to follow from the very beginning of your [write my paper](#). As such, your paper should:

- Be in a typed format.
- Have double spacing.
- Employ a paper size of 8.5" by 11".
- Have 1" margins on all sides.
- Have a page header/running head atop every page.
- Have the page number, along with a shortened title of your paper in the header. With the title written in block letters.

Font

The font is something that matters a lot in writing because your work needs to be legible enough for people to read it. So, the next time you're lying in your warm bed and you suddenly remember that I forgot to [paper writing service](#). Make sure that you write in a 12-point sans serif font, preferably Times New Roman.

Structure

Everything needs to have a well-defined structure in order to be effective, a paper is no exception. Thus, make sure your paper has the following:

- A title page that gives information about the paper. Things like the title, author name, and organization you are writing the paper for.
- Abstract on a separate page that gives a summary of the entire paper.
- A body that has all the main points of your paper. Making sure that each body paragraph starts with a concise and focused topic sentence.
- References at the very end of your paper on a separate page and written in proper APA format.

The Citations

Adding citations to your work is perhaps the hardest thing to do while following a specific format. Which is why many people just **pay for essay** and let someone else worry about the technical stuff. That is unless you have the useful pointers for citing sources of an [essay writer](#) mentioned below.

What you need to do is simple really, once you get the hang of it that is. For every source you use, just add the author's name and year of publication at the end in parenthesis.

For instance, if you're using information from a book written by someone named Albert in 2001. At the very end of your text simply add (Albert, 2001). And voila, you just cited your first source.

But make sure that for each citation that appears in your text, there is a complete reference for it at the end of your paper. References that go in your reference list, as mentioned under the structure heading above.

And in case you are referring to single or multiple pages of a source. Simply add the [write my paper for me](#) page numbers following "p." for a single page and "pp." for multiple pages.

And that covers everything you need to know about writing a paper in APA style. Getting a hang of it takes a little practice. But you are sure to find any help you need online if you hit a snag along the way.
